



## Tradescantia

*T. fluminensis*, *T. pallida*, *T. zebrina*

Within the *Tradescantia* genus, you'll find 75 herbaceous perennials commonly referred to as wandering Jew plants or spiderwort. No matter which variety you're drawn to, these are hardy, fast-growing, and low-maintenance species. Their attractive colorful foliage will trail, spread, or climb, making them especially striking in hanging planters—or in any corner of your space that could use a burst of color.
